We have monthly jazz events from September to June. Our historic venue has become well known as a great jazz venue in the city. We had another full house at our January jazz event. Each month we have a different Calgary jazz group playing many different styles of jazz including their own compositions. You are lucky to be so close and be able to walk to the community centre for these great events. We suggest you come early, enjoy a beverage and get a good seat.

Community parks are not off-lease parks

We frequently see people with dogs in our community parks that are also **playgrounds**. Unfortunately, we also often see many dogs off-lease. While it is great for the dogs to run around, our playground parks are not offlease parks. When dogs can run free in our parks, there often are problems. I will mention two complaints I have received as examples of these problems. One was a community resident who took her dog that was onlease to the park on the north side of the community centre. Another dog that was off-lease in the park became aggressive towards the on-lease dog. Another was when children from the Montessori School were in the park on the north side of the community centre. An off-lease dog was aggressive towards the children. Both examples have off-lease dogs that became aggressive and since they were off-lease, the owner could not control that dog. The only place in our community that is off-lease in our community is up the escarpment south of the community centre. There is a flat natural area (not groomed) that is off-lease. Please keep your dogs on-lease in our playground parks and pick up after your dog.

New Community Website

Proposed development at 25th Avenue and 5th Street SW

We have learned this proposal will go to Planning Commission in February. We still do not vet know when the public hearing on this matter will be held but it is getting closer. This is a major planning and development file for us. Since the beginning of this process, the community association has made it clear we do not support this land use change to accommodate a building that would be three times as high as allowed under the current land use. However, we also have made it clear we are not against the proposed use – seniors living.

Ultimately there will be a public hearing of City Council to approve or not to approve the land use change that is required for what is proposed to be built. This means this will be a political decision. We will let you know when the public hearing is scheduled. Anyone interested can submit a letter prior to the hearing and can speak for five minutes at the hearing. We will also let you know what additional steps you can do to make your views know to City Council and some key points you can make. This will be critical to swaying how council responds to this proposal.

The current land use is M-C2 with a height limitation of 16 metres and a FAR (Floor Area Ratio) of 2.5. They are applying for Land Use District MU-1, which allows a height of 45 meters and FAR of 7.5, so around three times the current approved land use. While we support increased density and the Area Redevelopment Plan supports increased density, historically as already stated, the number one planning and development issue in our community has been height. Our message has been consistent over the years when proposals such as this one come forward.

We have heard the applicant has been talking to city administration in regard to a possible payment for a community amenity if this proposal is approved by council. From our point of view, it is premature to be discussing this as there is no current legal mechanism in place. It is strictly a hypothetical discussion. If council chooses to approve this proposal, then that is time such discussions and community consultation should take place. The community association will not make any comments on this possibility at this time as we oppose this proposal.

Winter Eve Care

Your eyes need extra care in the winter. We asked ophthalmologist Dr. Jessica Ting, from the Eye Institute of Alberta, and optometrist Dr. Scott Lopetinsky for advice to keep your eyes at their best all season long.

Wear sunglasses. In winter, around 80 per cent of the sun's UV rays bounce off the snow and into our eyes. Those UV rays increase the risk of cataracts and macular degeneration. Polarized lenses block harmful rays. If you're skiing or snowboarding, don't forget goggles.

Use good eye drops and turn on the humidifier. Cold, dry winter air can dry your eyes. Ask your eye doctor about lubricating eye drops. Consider getting a humidifier to keep air moist.

Wash your hands. Pinkeye, also known as viral conjunctivitis, is common during flu season and is very contagious. If you have it, avoid touching your eyes and wash vour hands often.



The hall has two areas, which can be used as one big hall or divided by a rolling partition. Both parts together can fit 104 people standing or 80 seated (sufficient chairs and tables for 80 are included in the rental).

Kitchen with stove, oven, fridge and microwave (dishes, utensils, coffeemaker, kettle, etc. not provided). There is also a wet bar with double fridge with glass doors. There is a big screen to use for presentations/films (projector not provided).

Restrictions:

Smoking and the consumption of alcohol are not permitted in the hall.

Rental fees:

NEW ACCESSIBLE CANADA ACT: Eliminating barriers and ensuring greater opportunities for Canadians with disabilities

In 1991, I was the victim of a random act of gun violence and became a C5 quadriplegic. My life changed forever, and I got to see firsthand the everyday issues that Canadians with disabilities face—including tasks as ordinary as going to the bank to deposit a cheque.

Since entering politics 12 years ago, it has been my goal to help Canada become a community where people with disabilities reach their individual potential and are recognized as valued citizens.

That is why I am so proud of our federal Liberal government's new Accessible Canada Act, the most significant piece of legislation for the rights of persons with disabilities in over 30 years.

The Act will benefit all Canadians, but particularly the 14% of Canadians who have physical or mental disabilities, including many seniors.

The Accessible Canada Act will ensure that federallyregulated buildings and services are accessible to seniors and persons with disabilities. This includes federal government departments, Crown corporations, banks, airports and more.

This is a comprehensive piece of legislation that will fundamentally make things easier for people with disabilities across the country.

It will open more employment opportunities, through more equal workplace policies and practices.

Plus, it legally requires that there be opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in decision-making that directly impacts their lives.

The Accessible Canada Act represents a huge step forwards in knocking down the barriers faced by too many Canadians with disabilities, and I am proud to have been a part of it.

While an Albertan winter can give the impression that many things remain firmly frozen in place, the province's spaces and economic opportunities are continuing to grow and change for the benefit of all.

I'm always glad to see so many Albertans taking advantage of the province's world-renowned parks and trails year-round. In December, the Government of Alberta announced new provincial funding for trails, specifically for the 12 projects included in The Great Trail (formerly the Trans Canada Trail). The Great Trail stretches across 24,000 kilometers nationwide, with 3000 kilometers here in Alberta.

The new \$1.93 million in funding for the trails will be managed by Alberta TrailNet, a non-profit organization that represents the province for The Great Trail – the Alberta government has invested almost \$10 million in The Great Trail to date. Improvements to the trails will include enhancing the existing trail and adding bridges and signage, aiding hikers, skiers, and outdoor enthusiasts.

In southern Alberta, five wind projects partner private companies with First Nations to invest appx. \$1.2 billion in renewable energy in Alberta. These projects are made possible through the Alberta government's Renewable Electricity Program and will create about 1,000 jobs and generate about 760 megawatts of affordable renewable electricity; enough to power almost 300,000 homes.

Shannon Phillips, Minister of Environment and Parks: "These major private investments in southern Alberta wind projects also bring important professional service opportunities to downtown Calgary and new economic opportunities for Indigenous communities, making it a win-win for all Albertans." Support for the Renewable Electricity Program is made possible by reinvesting revenues from carbon pricing under the Climate Leadership Plan.

In downtown Calgary, the province is extending the Calgary Rivers District Community Revitalization Levy (CRL) to allow for the expansion of the BMO Centre (which will double the current size of the facility) and millions in infrastructure upgrades to East Victoria Park. This Alberta government investment will create 2,250 jobs and contribute \$223 million annually to Alberta's economy.
