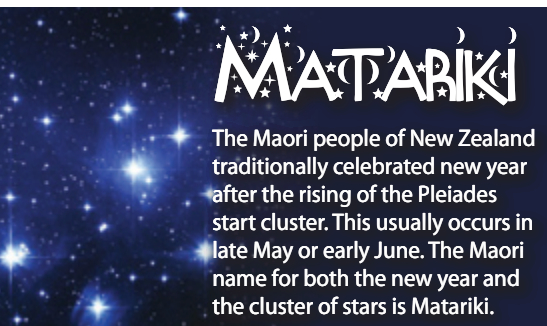

Pianist and composer Michelle Grégoire’s music has been described as “ingenious”, “elegant”, “balanced”, and “original with great depth and imagination”. She has toured across Canada with her jazz quintet and her music is heard regularly on XM Radio and various jazz programs across North America. An active freelance musician since 1984, Michelle Grégoire maintains a solid reputation as a leader and backup musician having recorded her own music (Diversity and Reaching), and having worked with several artists from across Canada and beyond. Grégoire holds a jazz degree from St. Francis Xavier University (1988, 1990), and a Master of Music degree in Jazz Studies from the Florida State University (1993). She has studied with world-renowned composers Maria Schneider, Kenny Wheeler and Bob Brookmeyer. Since the fall of 2014, Grégoire has been on the faculty of Ambrose University in Calgary teaching Jazz Piano.

For the January 3rd performance at the CBM Jazz Series, Michelle will be presenting original compositions and fresh arrangements, and will feature an impressive line-up of local performers with the addition of a special guest from Montréal, guitarist Mike Rud! This promises to be a fantastic evening of beautiful music and stellar performances.

Volunteers Needed for Community Casino March 18 & 19, 2018

Volunteers are needed for the community casino being held on March 18 and 19, a Sunday and Monday. This is the community association's largest fundraising activity, and we are allocated this opportunity about every year and a half. The funds are used to pay for rent, utilities, cleaning and maintenance of our community centre plus other special projects such as the new community entrance signs.

We need to fill 38 volunteer shifts. If you can, please volunteer for both days, or two shifts. You do not require previous casino experience to volunteer. We have professional advisors and many of us have helped at many casinos over the years. There are three shifts a day, one starting late morning until around suppertime. This is followed by an evening shift to closing time. Then there is a late shift (starts around 11 pm) for people who count all the money from the gaming tables. We feed you and there are snacks and non-alcoholic beverages. When not busy, you can read, watch a video, do homework, talk about world or local affairs or do other things like that. We can pay for babysitting if you need it. We can also provide a ride to and from Cash Casino (Blackfoot Trail) where our event is located. Casinos in Calgary are smoke free, so you will not have to worry about smoke.

While you may not yet know if you're available on March 18 and 19, **we need you to sign a volunteer form ASAP** so we can submit your form and those of others along with our final submission to Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission two months prior to the casino. We can adjust to your schedule as the date draws closer. Compost Your Real Christmas Tree

Make it a green Christmas and compost your real tree this year. There are now two ways to compost your real tree: Use your green cart **or** drop your real tree off at one of our 12 drop-off locations between December 25 and January 31. If composting in your green cart, follow the same steps as you would for branches in your yard. All trees should be free of lights, ornaments, tinsel, tree stands and string, and should not be wrapped or bagged. Visit Calgary.ca/christmastree for more information.

Did you know?

All trees collected will be composted with the other food and yard waste collected from the Green Cart program. By composting your Christmas tree, you can keep waste out of our landfills and reduce harmful greenhouse gas emissions.

myHome – New Application Process

Applying for a home improvement project just got 51 times easier. We're introducing a new online single application form for Calgarians (combining 51 forms into one!), to make applying for our services a whole lot simpler.

Subsidies Are Available for City Services

Need help accessing City of Calgary programs, services or facilities? The City has several programs that are offered at a subsidized rate, and some Transit passes are now available on a sliding scale, for Calgarians who may have trouble affording them. The new Fair Entry process makes applying for fee subsidized City-services easier.

One application allows Calgarians to have their income level assessed for several subsidy programs and services. Apply for:

1. Calgary Transit Low-Income Transit Pass Program and Low-Income Seniors Yearly Pass
2. Recreation Fee Assistance Program
3. Property Tax Assistance Program
4. No Cost Spay/Neuter Program
5. Seniors Services Home Maintenance

Our Community Hall is Available for Rental

If you're looking for a venue to host a meeting or event, our beautiful, conveniently-located heritage building might be just what you're looking for.

Location:
2201 Cliff St. SW

Capacity:
The hall has two areas, which can be used as one big hall or divided by a rolling partition. Both parts together can fit 104 people standing or 80 seated (sufficient chairs and tables for 80 are included in the rental).

Facilities:
Kitchen with stove, oven, fridge and microwave (dishes, utensils, coffeemaker, kettle, etc. not provided). There is also a wet bar with double fridge with glass doors. There is a big screen to use for presentations/films (projector not provided).

Restrictions:
Smoking and the consumption of alcohol are not permitted in the hall.

Rental fees:
\$200 for either 9 am to 4 pm (except during school days) or from 5 pm to 11 pm. The rate is reduced to \$120 per rental if renting 12 or more times per year. There is also a charity rate of \$75 per rental for charitable organizations with charitable number.

Please provide two or more exact dates and times, in order of preference. Please also indicate what your intended use will be. Safety First: Tobogganing and Sledding

Building Safe Communities Program

Winter is a great season to get outdoors, especially the thrill of tobogganing and/or sledding. Here are some helpful reminders if you decide to partake in this fun winter activity:

1. Inspect your ride

Inspect all your equipment for any cracks or broken parts, this includes toboggan or sled, helmet and ensure that you can keep your equipment under control.

2. Be cautious

Slide during the day time and in well-lit areas, be aware of potential hazards like holes, fences, trees and signs.

3. Ready, Set, Slide

Ensure the path is clear, keep control and kneeling or sitting feet first face is the safest method to ride.

4. Maintained hills

Did you know that the Parks and Bylaw prohibit toboggan or sledding downhill in a city-maintained park? However there are 20+ hills across the city that has been maintained for your safety. To find which hills are maintained for public use check the city website at calgary.ca

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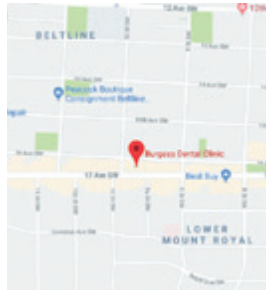
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
